UPCOMING PROGRAMS: MARCH

Susan Wolman will present a "hands-on, geometric no-sew art" project:

Here are some examples for inspiration. Our finished works of art have the potential to look like this!





As this is a "hands-on" program and you will need:

- Background fabric: One piece of solid or tone-on-tone suggested (Max 22 inches by 30 inches)
- Feature fabric: ½ yard (high contrast with background fabric)
- Fusible fleece: 22" x 30"
- Paper backed fusible web: ½ yard

While some of you may have all these supplies on hand, we realized that it might be difficult to easily obtain the fusibles, so the guild will supply 30 kits of fusible supplies on a first-come basis to make it easier for everyone to participate in our activity. Bring your own sharp scissors or mat and rotary cutters...whatever you think will work best for your design. Additional details will follow, but in the meantime, look around for some interesting shapes that you may find in your home that might serve as inspiration.

As noted in J Bo's message, all members are welcome to arrive after 11:00 a.m. This will give you time to set up for our no-sew project. You will also have time to prep your fabric before our class begins at the pressing stations that will be set up.

APRIL – CHARITY SEWING DAY

Jean Borsellino reminds us that plenty of supplies will be available from the VSQ stash for use in our Charity Sewing projects at our April 8 meeting. According to Jean, "I will bring an array of fabrics in all sizes to the March and April meetings so that members can put a quilt together using the VSQ stash."

Maria Eyckmans says: "We will be *Sewing for Charity* at our April meeting. To help make the day a success, we will need members to bring Sewing Machines, cutting boards, rotary cutters, rulers, scissors, thread, pins, ironing boards, irons, seam rippers, extra sewing machine needles and fabric.

"Feel free to work individually on your own projects or to work in groups of your choice.

"For those of you who don't have anything special in mind and need some easy suggestions, look up rail fence or disappearing nine patch – a couple of hard copies of these patterns will be available at the March meeting. There are many other free patterns online that may be of interest."
